#### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The market appears to be about stationary. Stocks are still moving actively. Hemlock and hardwoods are in most demand. There is no great movement of shingle stock. Reports of light stocks still come in. The outlook and tendency of prices is strong.

Reports received from the many lumber firms in the Ottawa Valley show that the recent rams have removed all danger of any of the logs being held up this season, Most of the stock is down to the main stream.

Mr. Jardine, Canadian Commissioner in South Africa, in a report to the Dominion Covernment, comments vigorously upon the recent shipment of building material for South Africa railways. He states that the material ordered was to be first-class, but when it arrived it was found to be inferior and was refused. There was a long delay before the shipment reached the Cape.

The lumber mills of new Ontario are working night and day, and although the market is taking large quantities the demand is still on the increase.

There is considerable call from U.S. dealers for all kinds of white pine lumber.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The demand for lumber is fairly good. The recent rains will swell the crop of logs that will reach the mills this season. The prices are about the same as last week.

At Bathurst, N. B., the mills are running day and night and they as well as the Caraquet mills are doing good work. In Nova Scotia the dealers report that they cannot supply the demand in all kinds of lumber. Hemlock, spruce and pine is going rapidly. There is a large demand for shingles and special stock also. At Liverpool, N. S., no stocks are on hand, and vessels waiting. The outlook and tendency of prices for export is good. There are upwards of 100,000 acres of good timber lands for sale near this place. Most of it is a pine tract of virgin forest that has never had an axe in it, pienty of pines two and three feet on the stump.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

In Winnipeg and Maniteba generally the demand for building stock is active. Judge Richards, of Winnipeg, has been commissioned by the Dominion Government to inquire into the charge that lumber dealers have formed a combine as alleged by the Hon. Thos. Greenway. The work of the commission will begin at once. The talk of the new railway from Quebec to Winnipeg, north of the C.P.R., has created a demand for back limits above the height of land.

On the Pacific coast conditions are very peculiar. One large company closed down temporarily the other day from inability to secure enough white labor. The management sought to fill the gap with Chinese labor, but the white workers then threatened to go out and the people showed themselves hostile to the Mongolian. The lumber company is now seeking white labor. As a result of the strike in the local mills it is reported by telegraph that the Vancouver mill men decided to refuse to fillt the local orders for lumber. Shipments by rail and water to outside points will be made as usual, but no lumber will be supplied for local work until the strike is settled. It is also reported that a meeting of the British Columbia Lumbermen's Association will be held this week to consider the advisability of shutting down all logging camps for a period to be agreed upon. This is said to be the result of the unsatisfactory condition of the log market. The General Manager of the C. P. R. reports great evidence of thrift and prosperity in British Columbia, particularly in the shipment of lumber to the Orient, to Eastern Canada and to the United States.

There is a rumor that all the large Puget Sound red cedar shingle mills would shut down for a while as trade is reported dull. A prominent coast timber man reports that logs cannot be sold in Vancouver at any price. He claims there is an over stocking in the market and that logs are more plentiful than they have been for years. Logs have recently been sold for a third off the usual price.

Americans have been purchasing limits on Vanuouver Island on a gigantic scale. Nine hundred million feet have been pur chased on the Nanaimo river, French Creek, and Alberni district for a San Francisco Company. This syndicate has a capital of \$100,000,000 and have balf a dozen large saw mills in operation in the various coast cities which have been unable to meet foreign demands. The price paid for these lands range from \$5 to \$50 an acre, according to location and quality. Several thousand acres have been acquir-
