Sealed proposals for a Refuse Crematory for the City of Winnipeg, addressed to the Chairman Market, Licence and Health Committee and marked "Tenders for Crematory," will be received at the office of the undersigned up to 8.30 p.m. on

Tuesday, May 16, 1900.

The present population of Winnipeg is 50,000. The approximate quantities of refuse to be disposed per annum are as follows:

Paper, Straw, Boxes, etc.,	Cubic yds.	3,000
Household refuse, etc.	" "	10,000
Night Soil	" "	2,000
Manure	" "	3,000
Animals	" "	100

Contractors are to guarantee their Crematory to dispose of the above quantities without creating a nuisance, and without offensive smoke. The Crematory is to be so designed that it may be added to as the requirements increase. Contractors may state price at which they will erect a crematory, complete and hand it over to the City, or price which they would charge for full working plans and all patented rights to use the Crematory.

Proposals are to be accompanied by cash, draft or accepted cheque for the sum of \$25,000, which will be forfeited in case of failure on the part of contractor to enter into a written agreement in the terms of his proposal within one (1) week from date of notice of acceptance.
