

AGREEMENT BETWEEN CANADA AND DENMARK FOR AIR SERVICES
SYA A BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES

The Government of Canada and the Government of Denmark (hereinafter called the Contracting Parties) having ratified the Convention on International Civil Aviation signed at Chicago on December 7, 1944, and desiring to establish these air communications between Canada and Denmark, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

Each Contracting Party grants to the other Contracting Party the rights specified in the Annex to this Agreement for the purpose of establishing the air services therein described (hereinafter called the agreed services) such services may be inaugurated immediately or at a later date at the option of the Contracting Party to whom the rights are granted.

Subject to Article 8, 5 and 6 of this Agreement, each of the agreed services may be operated as soon as the Contracting Party to whom the rights have been granted has designated an airline or airlines (hereinafter called the designated airlines) for the operation of the agreed services. The Contracting Party granting the rights shall, subject to Articles 8, 5 and 6 of this Agreement, be bound to grant without delay the appropriate operating permission to the airline concerned.

ARTICLE 2

Each of the designated airlines may be required to satisfy the competent aeronautical authorities of the other Contracting Party that it is qualified to fulfil the conditions prescribed under the laws and regulations normally applied by those authorities to the operations of international commercial air services.

ARTICLE 3

In order to prevent discriminatory practices and to ensure equality of treatment the Contracting Parties agree that:

(1) Each of them may impose or permit to be imposed on airlines of the other State just and reasonable charges for the use of public airports and other facilities on its territory provided that these charges shall not be higher than would be paid for the use of such airports and facilities by its national airlines engaged in similar international services;
