Mr. Jacques Kuoh-Moukouri this morning presented his Letter of Credence as first Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Cameroun to Canada.

The ceremony took place at Government House at 11:00 a.m. Mr. Henry F. Davis, Chief of Protocol, Department of External Affairs, presented the Ambassador to His Excellency the Governor-General. Mr. Marcel Cadieux, Deputy Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs, and Mr. Esmond Butler, Secretary to the Governor-General, were in attendance on the Governor-General on this occasion.

Mr. Kuoh-Moukouri has held various administrative positions in the service of his government since 1947. With the independence of Cameroun in 1960 he became Ambassador in Paris which position he held until his present appointment as concurrent Ambassador in Washington where he will continue to reside.

Mr. Kuoh-Moukouri is married.
