The Honorable Mr. Campbell reported to the House that he, and those Members of this House who are Members of the Privy Council, had waited upon His Excellency the Governor General, with the Address of this House in answer to His Excellency's Speech from the Throne, and that His Excellency had been pleased to return the following most gracious answer:

I thank you for your dutiful and loyal Address, and for the assurance that the Public Business will receive your attention.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Fergusson Blair, it was

Ordered, That the Address to His Excellency the Governor General, in answer to His Excellency's Speech from the Throne, together with His Excellency's reply thereto, be printed and published in both languages, for the use of Members.

The Honorable Mr. Wilmot moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Campbell,
That the subject of enquiring into the cost of publishing the Debates of the Senate be referred to the Select Committee appointed to examine and report upon the Contingent Accounts of this House for the present Session, with instructions to report thereon.

After Debate,
The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and

Ordered accordingly.
The Honorable Mr. Campbell moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Fergusson Blair,

That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General respectfully requesting that His Excellency will be pleased to communicate to the Senate any Royal Instructions which he may have received respecting the passing of Bills by Parliament.

The question of concurrence being put thereon the same was resolved in the affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That such Members of the Privy Council as are Members of this House du wait on His Excellency the Governor General, with the said Address.

Then, on motion of the Ionorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Fergusson Blair,

The House adjourned.
