contribution to knowledge." There are at McGill many opportunities for graduate students to broaden their outlook in literature, science, and philosophy, and a large number take advantage of these opportunities.

In some few cases, however, great advances have been made by men with a narrow and concentrated outlook, but these men have made a personal sacrifice for the good of the community.

It is interesting to note that there is a general desire on the part of those who are conducting graduate work to raise "in some way the scientific standard of the students who <u>enter McGill.</u>" The immediate solution seems to be:

- (1) A twelfth grade in the High Schools.
- (2) Honour matriculation and four years at McGill in the Science Branch in the Faculty of Arts and Science.
- (3) A most careful planning of that four years' course, which cannot be done in a day; it must be evolved !
