

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL O.

An Act for the relief of Archibald Charles Henry Morris.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Archibald Charles Henry Morris, domiciled in Canada and residing at the town of Elmira, in the province of Ontario, factory foreman, has by his petition alleged that on the thirtieth day of June, A.D. 1908, at the said town, he and Laura Musser, who was then of the said town, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: 5
Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:— 10

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Archibald Charles Henry Morris and Laura Musser, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever. 15

Right to marry again.

2. The said Archibald Charles Henry Morris may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Laura Musser had not been solemnized. 20
