There was no explanation as to why his telegram was not delivered to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, who was on the floor of the house, from 8 o'clock last evening until after 2 o'clock this morning. As a matter of fact, it is well known in Ottawa that Mr. Sifton was to return to-day, and last night it was common gossip that the depate would be adjourned to permit him to be heard.

The postmaster had not carried on any private business, and even if he had done so, it should be remembered that his salary was only \$900.
