NO POLITICS IN REMOVAL SO AYLESWORTH ASSURES

But Other Cases Are Cited, Said to Be More Flagrant, Which Are Not Noticed.

Ottawa, May 2.—(Special).—This afternoon in the house of commons, Hon. Clifford Sifton (Brandon) rose to a question of privilege.

He had only learned last night, he said, by a telegram, received at New York, that his name had been mentioned in the long drawn out debate on the North Atlantic Trading Company.

Some excitement amounting to disorder prevailed during the debate upon the removal of the postmaster at Cannington, Col. Sam Hughes (Victoria) argued to show that the charges related to the removal of the postmaster had not carried on any private business, and even if he had done so, it should be remembered that his salary was only \$900.

Mr. Hughes proceeded to show that this removal had been thrown up to the Hon. C. D. Grant (Ontario), who was embittered against the government respecting the tenders for the Grand Trunk Pacific.

In reply Col. Hughes, Hon. Mr. Aylesworth disclaimed that there had been any politics in the case at Cannington. There had been complaints made by the postmaster, but they were well-founded. He disputed the doctrine of vested rights in holding offices.

Mr. Ingram (Elgin) called attention to other cases at Woodstock, Leamington and Nanapanee. At the last named town the postmaster devoted his entire time to his practice as a physician.

Mr. Lancaster (Lincoln and Niagara) feared that there was something behind this affair at Cannington. He challenged the doctrine announced by Mr. Aylesworth, that postmasters could be removed at his mere whim.

Mr. Lancaster thought it peculiar that there should be so vast a difference between the sentence meted out to Noel Gaudreau by Judge Bossé in the criminal court this morning.

TELEPHONE FOR WEST POCKET IS OF WIRELESS VARIETY

Invention of New York Man—Pillars Messages From Wires Three Miles Away.

Charles E. Alden of New York, who has been pursuing experiments since last fall in wireless telephoning, has, says, solved the problem of wireless telephoning, and the result is so simple that it can be put into a wireless variety.

Mr. Alden, while studying the problem, constructed an instrument so small that it can be put into a vest pocket, which, attached to a wireless battery, such as is used by the Marconi system, at once became an effective wireless carrier along ordinary telephone wires.

It was one stormy night a few weeks ago, when Mr. Alden had perfected his little receiver and set it up in his studio here on Market Street, that he was sitting at his desk, and he was smoking his pipe and wondering where he had better set up his sending apparatus, that he was startled by the sound of a voice in the room of which he was the only occupant.

Like a flash Mr. Alden realized the situation. His little instrument was not waiting for his sending instrument to be set up, but was picking up messages from the New England Telephone Company's wire which ran along a road three miles away.

Mr. Alden told the story of his discovery and how the voice of the night came to him unbidden, like the talk of spirits. "I was sitting in my room one night when it dawned upon me that with the wireless telegraph comparatively simple the wireless telephony must be equally simple."

No wire was attached to the receiving instrument, the latter simply being placed on a table in a room. At present Mr. Alden is working on the sending parts of the apparatus. The possibilities are almost limitless. With this new invention one may yet be able to carry around in his pocket a private telephone, with which he can call up his business and talk with his family wherever he may be.
