A SANITARIUM FOR TORONTO

Certain Medical Gentlemen Launch a Project for Establishing a Local Consumptive Sanitarium. A movement is now under way among certain members of the medical profession to establish a consumptive sanitarium in the immediate vicinity of the city.

It is the intention to have near one of the trolley lines, which run out of the city on either of which there are very good elevated sites, and to make it a first-class institution in every respect as relates to general equipment, providing all well-recognized modern methods for the most scientific treatment of patients, yet on an economical plan.

The promoters feel assured that there is a very general feeling amongst city practitioners in favour of such an institution. The Lancet speaks of the project, and the editor concludes his article as follows: "It cannot be denied that the local consumptive sanitarium, where only specially-selected cases can be placed, will be a distinct relief to the general public."
