

SHARP ADVANCE IN WHEAT.

Towards the Close the Market Was Active on Heavy Buying.

Chicago Was Oversold and When Shorts Commenced to Buy There Was a Scramble to Get on the Long Side of the Market - The Trade in Live Stock.

Review of Trade. There is little feature in the markets this week at Toronto, says R. G. Dun & Co., beyond the general activity that prevails in such lines as dry goods, groceries, metals, provisions and live stock.

Wheat and flour markets show indications of a slight advance, although red and white wheat is not so much in demand as it was a few days ago.

The crop reports throughout Ontario are uniformly favorable, and the railroads are looking for 8000 farm laborers in Ontario to go west and harvest the Manitoba wheat crop.

There is a demand for more product to satisfy the demand, and provisions are up 1/4c. A demand from lumbermen for large lots bids fair to completely deplete stocks.

Butter and cheese continue to be taken up by exporters, the English market being in very satisfactory shape.

Some manufacturers are said to be preparing to export, and there is a great complaint from consumers over the price of butter.

Full millinery openings take place in three weeks, and importations are now coming in. There are much lighter than usual, iron and metals continue very firm in prices and manufacturers here too complain of lack of material.

Small goods in the hardware line are steadily advancing in price. Settling up day passed off in a most satisfactory manner, very few renewals being required. The stock market has shown a slight advance, speculation being light, although values hold up well. Money on call is quoted at 5 per cent.
