Mrs. John Vinterva, one of the victims, sent her 7-year-old grand-daughter to a drug store to buy a mixture of castor oil and almond oil, Mrs. Vinterva took a large dose of the medicine, which the child procured, and then gave a little to her 7-monthsold granddaughter. Mrs. Vinterva was dead in a few minutes, and the baby girl died in a hospital shortly afterwards. The druggist's boy, who is thought to have prepared the concoction, was arrested.




