Bridgeport, Conn., May 15.—The conductors and motormen employed by the Connecticut Railway and Lighting Company here went on strike to-day, tying up all the lines in the city. At a meeting early to-day the Trolleymen's Union refused to accept a proposition of the company, granting a slight increase in wages. The company refused to recognize the union. About 225 men are out.
