No changes have been made in the regulations or in the certificates required to be made on invoices. But a clause has been added to the regulations defining and interpreting the clause in the act respecting the suriax, which provides for its application to articles, the chief value of which was produced in Germany, altho they may have been enhanced in value by the labor of axo, her country, notwithstanding the provisions of the British preferential tariff.

The defining clause in the regulations reads as follows: "In determining whether or not any article imported into Canada which has been produced, improved, or advanced in value by the labor of any country other than Germany is subject to the surtax by reason of a portion of the value thereof having been produced in Germany, the fair market value of the article or material grown, produced or manufactured in Germany, which has entered into the manufacture of the article imported into Canada shall be held to be the value produced in Germany within the morning of the Tariff Act respecting the surtax."


