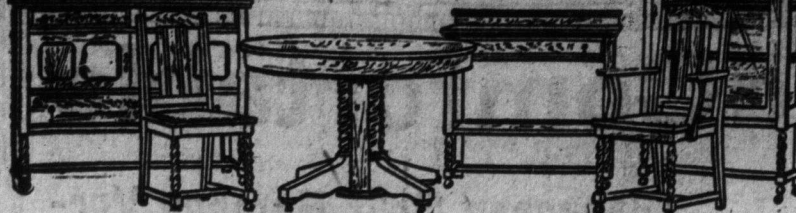

EXAMINATION RESULTS

One Candidate for Degree in Science and Agriculture.

Degrees, as shown below, will be conferred at the convocation to be held in the Castle Memorial Hall, McMaster University, this evening. It will be noted that there is one candidate for the degree of B.Sc. (Agr.), which is given on completion of a course, the first two years of which are taken in the university, and the remaining two at the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph. This course has been arranged through the co-operation of the education department, and the various universities of the province, and the degree is accepted as the academic qualification for a specialist in both science and agriculture, and for a public school inspector's certificate. This is the first time the degree has been conferred in the province.
