

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

OCT. 20, 1871.—E. Archbold, Esq., was appointed a member of the Committee on Salaries, vice Hon. M. B. Almon.

A grant of \$60 per annum was made to Rawdon on condition that the people make up \$188 per annum for the Incumbent—the condition to be required from the 1st October.

In accordance with the recommendation at the general meeting, the sub-Committee on Salaries, together with the Dean, W. H. Wiswell, and E. D. Meynell, Esqs., were appointed a sub-Committee to consider the resources and ability of parishes and missions applying to the D. C. S. for aid.

It was directed that the clergy receiving aid from D. C. S. be paid in Canada currency from the 1st July, 1871.

It was *Resolved*, that the clergy be requested to hold quarterly meetings in their parishes to promote the objects of the Society.
