THE NORTH SEA FLEET. Description of the British Trawlers Recently Fired on by the Russians.

Apropos of the recent incident in the North Sea where a Russian admiral fired upon a fleet of British Trawlers and thereby almost plungged the two nations into war the following description of the trawling fleet written for the Boston Transcript by Benjamin Sharp, Ph. D. will be of interest. He says in part:—
