THE COMING ELECTIONS

Canada is to elect a new house of commons. The elections will be held within the next three months. The campaign will be marked by unusual bitterness, but it will help to clear the air.

That the consideration of the terms of the said resolution should be deferred until the government brings before parliament measures providing that those able to pay will be asked to contribute their full share to the cost of the war, and by which all agricultural, industrial, transportation and natural resources of Canada will be organized to the entire and the war and the cost of living to the Canadian people.

It goes without saying that the Conservative press and speakers will use the loyalty cry to the limit. The Standard lingers up to the fray by referring in leaves type to "disloyal Liberal partisans," "liberal reactionists," and a "nest of traitors."

New Members Of British Cabinet

Churchill Back and Sir Eric Geddes and Edwin Samuel Montagu Join Government

London, July 17—Sir Edward Carson has relinquished his post as first lord of the admiralty, and joined the war cabinet without portfolio, according to an official announcement issued this evening.

Major-General Sir Eric Geddes, the new first lord of the admiralty, was only recently appointed director-general of transportation, with the rank of vice-admiral.

Edwin Samuel Montagu, a former cabinet minister, is made secretary for India.
