FRENCH MARINES
LANDED IN HAYTI

Cruiser's Captain Did Not Stand
on Ceremony—Foreigners in
Danger as Result of Rebellion

Washington, June 25.—As a result of the commander of the French cruiser Descartes having landed marines at Cape Haytien, Hayti, to protect foreign interest there, the navy department has ordered the armored cruiser Washington from Vera Cruz to the Haytien port. No United States ship was available for Haytien waters to send a landing force ashore because of fighting between government and rebel troops, and the French commander did not stand on ceremony, but put his marines on the beach promptly. The naval yacht Eagle was supposed to be observing the Haytien situation, but had gone to Guantamano to coal.

Admiral Caperton, commanding the squadron on the east coast of Mexico, is taking his flagship to Hayti, so by virtue of seniority on his arrival he will be able to take charge of the situation. It is expected the French will be promptly withdrawn, and Admiral Caperton will then thank them for their services in the interests of foreigners.

The situation in Hayti is reported to be even worse than it was a year ago, when the administration had under consideration proposals for strong measures in Hayti which would restore law and order.

BLAST KILLS MINING
ENGINEER AND WEALTHY
INVESTOR AT COBALT.

Cobalt, Ont., June 25.—Scott Eldridge, mining engineer, of Philadelphia, and W. B. Foote, a wealthy mining investor, of Geneva City (N. Y.), were instantly killed by a blast at Kerr Lake about 4 o'clock this afternoon.

Eldridge was taking Foote down the Kerr Lake mine, and they were in the slope at the 140 foot level when the blast went off at the regular time at the 250 foot level, and coming up the slopes killed both men instantly.

Foote, who was about forty-five years of age, had been in this camp for two or three days, looking over properties in which he had large investments. He was unmarried.

Eldridge was mining engineer of Kerr Lake mine. He was unmarried, and about 25 years of age. His relatives live in Philadelphia.

DENIAL THAT CANADIAN
PRISONERS IN GERMAN
HANDS ARE STARVING.

London, June 25.—Much indignation is expressed regarding the appeal made by the Evening News on behalf of Canadian prisoners in Germany who are alleged to be starving. Mrs. Rivers Bulkeley, who is directing the department of the Canadian Red Cross charged with the distribution of food parcels to Germany, states that such an appeal is quite unnecessary, as her department is ready to take care of all cases. Colonel Hodgkiss has written to the News pointing out that Canada is not negligent in this respect.

GERMANS PLANNED
TO CONTROL CALAIS

Special Arrangements Were Made
at This "Gateway to Britain"

(Toronto News Correspondence)
London, June 25.—I have learned that especially careful provision was made by the Germans before the war to dominate Calais, which was considered the gateway to Britain. An organized attempt was made to control the factories of the district. Calais included a large number of Germans among its civilian population and their arrogance and bravado dampened the spirits of the French.

A marvellous service of espionage was instituted. Taverns were kept by Germans and through their intoxicated customers they tried to obtain much precious information. A number of villas situated strategically inexplicable at the time because of their singular transformations and changes, are quite explained now. In one of these the police found a complete apparatus of naval war signals, a strong wireless telegraphic apparatus, and solid platforms capable of supporting big howitzers and other heavy guns.

RELUCTANTLY PUTS
IT UP TO GARLAND

Important Admissions by Drug
Clerk in Ottawa Inquiry—Mc-
Bride on the Stand

Ottawa, June 25.—Sir Charles Davidson's war contracts investigation today put the finishing touches on the prima facie case made out before the Public Accounts Committee last session in reference to the connection of W. F. Garland, Conservative M. P. for Carleton county, with the \$9,000 of profits which his drug clerk, Ernest Powell, made last August in selling surgical supplies to the militia department.

It will be remembered that last session Mr. Garland, from his seat in parliament, protested his innocence of any attempt to personally profit from the exigencies of the country's war needs, and that he is now seeking re-nomination as the party standard bearer in Carleton, and publicly announces that he "will control the patronage."

This afternoon his \$18-per-week drug clerk, who handled the \$40,000 worth of business done with the militia department, after much hesitation and much urging from the commissioner and the examining counsel, "coughed up" the whole story.

Garland got from Powell practically all the profits, and the latter was, in effect, merely the stool pigeon in whose name the orders were put through. Then when the Public Accounts Committee got on the trail last March and the ex-orbitant middleman's profits made in Powell's name were disclosed, Garland gave the money back to Powell, who returned it to the treasury, via the chairman of the Public Accounts Committee. Ottawa, June 25.—Sir Richard McBride took occasion this afternoon to protest his innocence and patriotism before the royal commission on war contracts, presided over by Sir Charles Davidson. Sir Richard declared that there was no graft in the purchases through him of the two submarines last August from the Chilean government and he strongly disavowed the scandalous rumor set afloat by certain evil-minded politicians in regard to the payment of several hundred thousand dollars over and above the original contract price. It didn't tend to sharpen a man's patriotism, said Sir Richard.

Auditor-General Fraser, who also took a small hand in the proceedings, said that his investigations had been prompted because of the many suspicious things brought to his attention, and he thought that the whole matter might now be cleared up by getting the evidence of J. B. Patterson of Seattle, to whom the money was paid.

McKay, Opera House manager, and the members of the company were warmly thanked by the ladies for their cordial readiness to assist the cause of the soldier.
