Story of Nell Gwyn in Big English Picture at Imperial Monday

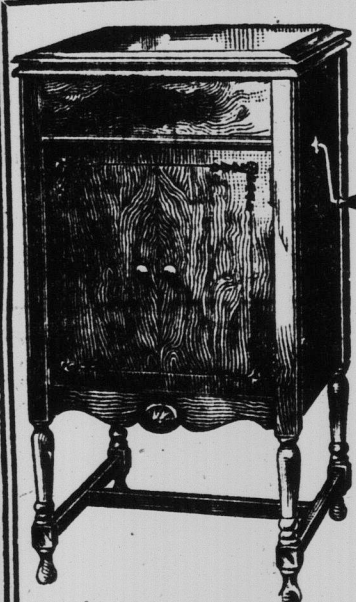

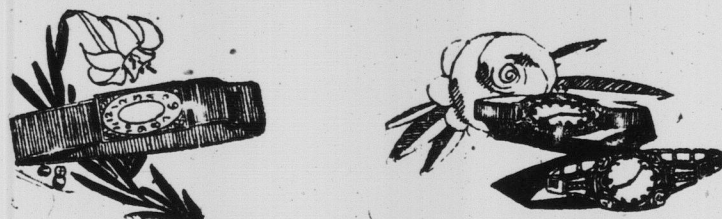
RIGID INSPECTION

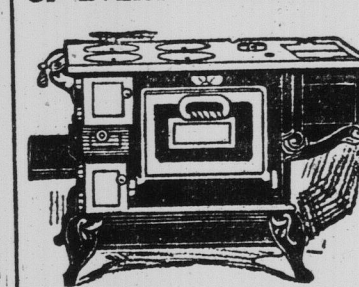
