MADE 2,000 LIQUOR RAIDS IN 12 MONTHS

Pennsylvania Agents Report
Seizures That Netted
\$299,679 Value.

Philadelphia, Oct. 25.—Two thousand raids made by an average force of ten agents netted liquor confiscations to the value of \$299,679 in the year ended August 1. William J. McClure, head of prohibition agents in Philadelphia, has reported. About 80 per cent. of the raids were made in Philadelphia, the remainder in southeastern Pennsylvania and southern New Jersey.

The raids were directed against 624 saloons and hotels, 268 so-called "cider saloons," 944 dwellings, 896 stores and 43 instances of liquor in transportation. Under the classification of "stores," McClure reported, were shoe, delicatessen, dry goods, grocery, produce, hardware, jewelry, candy, meat and cigar shops where liquor was found, not to mention restaurants, "hot dog" stands, poolrooms and bootblack stands.

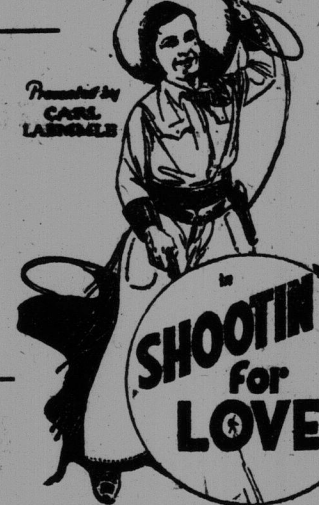
