

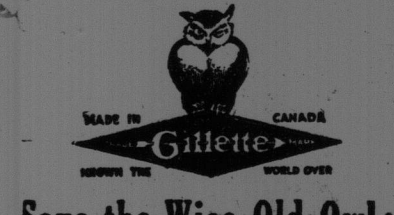

Children's Society Take Up Case of Polish Boy and He Does Not Like It.

New York, Oct. 24.—Samuel Rzeszewski, a ten year old Polish chess prodigy, appeared in court yesterday on a charge of being without proper guardianship. The little fellow was released in \$1,000 bail.

## TOMMY TEBB HAS NARROW ESCAPE

The well known junior skater, Tommy Tebb, had a narrow escape from serious injury yesterday afternoon when he was thrown from his bicycle after a collision with an automobile driven by Dr. C. G. Corbett. Dr. G. B. Peat was also in the car so that there was no lack of medical assistance after the accident although it was practically unnecessary as Tommy escaped with a wrenched wrist in an almost miraculous manner. Dr. Corbett was driving along the Marsh road when, in moving to one side to avoid a heavy truck, he saw the lad on the bicycle ahead of him. Everything possible was done to avert a crash but the two machines collided and the lad was thrown off his bicycle which caught under the front wheel of the automobile. The wrist was quickly bandaged and Tommy started off immediately for his home, apparently little worse for his spill.

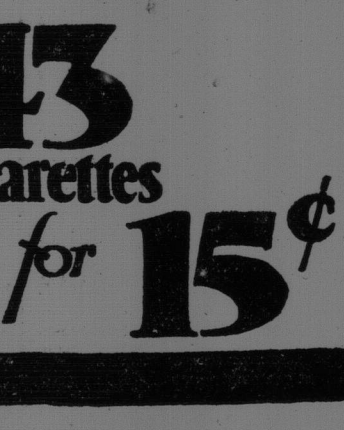

**THE QUESTION OF ST. PETER'S Y.M.A.**

Statement of Case, Presented to A. A. U. of C. by T. K. Sweeney, is Referred to Judge Jackson.

P. J. Legge, recently appointed secretary of the Maritime branch of the A. A. U. of C., in an interview last night made a strong plea for a united association back of President A. W. Covey. He contended that Mr. Covey's re-election was a complete vindication of his efforts during last year to place the maritime provinces on sound financial footing. He said that 1,680 cards had been issued since April 1. Sanctions during last year to place championships, forty-three clubs are affiliated with the union, and twenty bulletins had been issued.

Mr. Legge referred to an attempt made at the meeting recently by St. Peter's Y. M. A. for reinstatement. He said that a threat of legal action had failed to restore the local club in good standing and that the whole matter was referred to Judge Jackson of Calgary.

ended they have not) they did not do so.

"That even though the A. A. U. of Canada had authorized the use of an affidavit, justices or other persons having power to take affidavits are restrained from doing so unless they are required or authorized by some law of Canada or of the province in which it is to be used. The penalty for receiving or permitting an unauthorized affidavit to be taken is a fine of \$50 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months; and that the A. A. U. of Canada, the parent body, has legislated with regard to suspensions and has laid down the procedure to be followed, which in the case of St. Peter's Y. M. A. the maritime branch has not followed.

"The maritime province branch (not possessing the authority in its constitution or by-laws) has, in adopting the affidavit, attempted to change the rules governing suspension of the A. A. U. of C., which is beyond its jurisdiction. The affidavit is not made voluntarily but under the threat of suspension and so does not come within the provisions of the Canada Evidence Act.

"That no amendment to the constitution or by-laws of the branches can be made except by a two-thirds vote of members present at a meeting, which amendment does not become operative until approved by the board of governors of the A. A. U. of C. The resolution to adopt the affidavit was passed by a majority vote, falling considerably below a two-thirds vote and as not even yet been approved.

"The St. Peter's Y. M. A. was suspended during the last summer because of the failure of its members to take the affidavit. No charges have been laid against any of its member or it is believed that any could not conscientiously take the affidavit. The St. Peter's baseball team, which has been playing in St. John during the summer, is a separate organization.
