INDIAN THIEVES

THE CLEVEREST IN THE WORLD

Master minds and large gangs of specially trained and thoroughly organized crooks are for the most part the creation of the morose. But if they are moving picture scenarios. But if they are transferred the scene from the United States to India they could prove themselves guileless of the charge of exaggeration. For in India are whole bands of tribes who are trained almost from birth in various branches of crime and have attained a cleverness that English-speaking or European crooks may never hope to reach. Whereas the little desperadoes are taught that if they do it is wrong to lie or steal, these clever thieves they become, the more they are taught. The boy begins to steal as soon as he can walk, and continues to steal until he becomes too old. Naturally with such training he becomes marvellously proficient.

Three Degrees.

A story of the operations of these criminal tribes is told by Rev. Benson Barker, who is now in New York, after having spent several years at Ajmer in the Bombay presidency. They are the descendants of the thugs and dacoits of an earlier generation, and belong to a separate caste. They consider manual labor degrading and do as little of it as possible. Before a young man is accepted as a full-fledged member of the caste or tribe he must pass with credit through three courses. The first is that of field robbery. He is expected to make a clean job of a field, and in some cases will even root up and carry off the seed grain, leaving behind no trace. The next course is that of stealing from barns and out-houses and lifting cattle or chickens. When he has perfected these forms of robbery, he is permitted to enter a house and

Prepared Alibis.

The Bhandas are noted for their expertness in snatching cattle and luxuries at a railroad station. They work in crowds, and the snatched article will travel through a dozen hands almost before the victim can give the alarm. The thieves owe obedience to the Naik, or chief, of their tribe, who directs most of their operations, but usually does not engage in them. It is his duty to prepare the alibi, and he is always the chief witness when one is arrested. Convictions are naturally hard to get, but when it appears that the police have evidence against a tribe, the Naik will decide which members shall surrender themselves and plead guilty. There is no appeal from his decision, and it is usually the less expert desperadoes who are selected as sacrificial goats. While they remain in prison their families are well taken care of, and their grieving wives provided with temporary husbands. Should these prisoners give information to the police they had better never return home, for a certain fate awaits them. At any rate, any of them would rather spend his time in prison than in manual labor.
