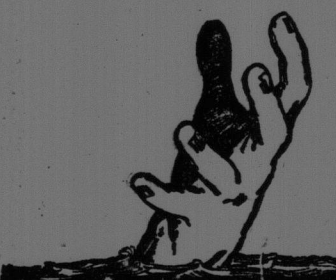

Service at 8 o'clock. Friends invited.

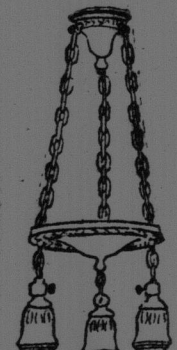
