**Home After Good Week.**  
St. Peter's baseball team arrived home last evening after their baseball trip to Moncton, Amherst and Truro. All say it was one of the best trips they were ever on. The treatment accorded them by the people of Amherst and those in Truro was greatly appreciated and all are unanimous in the statement that they are the best type of sports. In the former place prominent citizens threw open their homes to the members of the team, who were unable to secure hotel accommodation, and in addition entertained them to a musical and social party to their departure for Truro. In latter town the boys were taken for a tour around the town and surrounding country in automobiles, and after the game in the evening were tendered a banquet. All three towns can boast of good ball teams, and while St. Peter's won five out of their seven games, they met stiff opposition and had to fight hard for victory.

A large number of fans from this city journeyed to Moncton on Saturday to witness the two games and they formed a regular band of "royal roots." In the afternoon game St. Peter's won by a score of 9 to 4, and in the evening they again defeated the Vets, who were strengthened by some of the best players in Moncton. In the afternoon contest Priests and Cummings formed the battery for the All-Moncton team, and Stafford pitched for Moncton and Cummings and Addie caught, while Chestnut and Dever were at the points for the St. John boys. There were several accidents in the afternoon game, Joe Dever receiving an injury to his left knee in addition to having one of his thumbs quite badly hurt. Milan and Callaghan collided in left centre while going after Algie's fly, and both sustained minor injuries. In addition other members had fingers injured. On their arrival home last evening quite a number of fans were on hand to welcome the players and offer congratulations.

New York, July 12.—The half way mark of the major leagues baseball season views a close struggle between an eastern and western club for the leadership of each league. Brooklyn holds a one game advantage over Cincinnati in the National League while Cleveland, though possessing no game advantage over New York, has a lead of four points in the American League percentage column. All four teams won yesterday.

The heavy hitting of the Brooklyn and Cleveland clubs, with respective team averages of .387 and .344 for the last week, enabled them to rust their rivals from the coveted top position. The spurt of the Chicago Americans in winning seventeen of their last twenty-one games promises to bring about a three-cornered fight in the younger league.

The Brooklyn Nationals, who have won fifteen games in seventeen, possess a pitching staff that should be useful in coming double-headers. The Superbas were the only winning team in the National League last week. Cincinnati's record was 14-10.
