

### GIANT AIRSHIPS TO

CIRCLE THE EARTH

Giant airships, which will bring every important city in the world within ten days' journey of London, are foreshadowed by Sir Trevor Dawson, the managing director of Vickers, who expects to see airships twice or three times the size of R-34, while Brigadier-General Groves, R. A. F., forecasts airships of 8,000,000 cubic feet capacity, four times the size of R-34, capable of traveling 15,000 miles and with strong under carriages.

Ships of moderate size and high speed, for carrying express mails and passen-

gers;
Liners for passenger traffic, of a large size and high speed; and

Sir Trevor indicates that the firm's engineers are studying the possibilities of the use of steam engines in these great airships. We certainly look for success within a reasonable time," he added.

"We know more about the development of steam engines than about internal combustion engines. The result to be attained is to have an engine of sufficient power and not exceeding a certain limit of weight; with developments made recently in steam turbines this should not be a difficulty."

The cost of operation for a regular service would be at a passenger rate of 4d. per mile and a mail rate of 3d. per oz. With larger airships, carrying greater loads, lower rates might apply. By the use of a mooring-mast, or tower, to which the airship is moored by the nose, the dirigible would be able to ride out in any weather clear of the ground. The airship could easily be moored to, or released from, the tower in any wind up to sixty miles per hour without difficulty.

Passengers could get into or out of the ship by means of a lift in the tower, and so there would be no need to house the ship except for periodic overhaul and refit.



WHY WE SWEAR AND SMOKE

We are gaining on the drink habit, but obacco and bad language seem to be gaining upon us. This was the verdict of Professor Gilbert Murray, given in a lecture he delivered at Hampstead, Eng-

land.

"Tobacco," he observed, "is a slight narcotic poison. The use of bad language I take to be due to the slight nervous convulsion momentarily destroying self-control and releasing subconscious interests, which are normally suppressed."

He did not venture to say whether the use of this slight narcotic or bad language was beneficial, or whether, as some suggested, they should be confined to women and persons of sedentary habits.

Never in the history of the world had there been a society in which both men and women were so habitually under the influence of slight sedatives as at present. It might be temporary and of present. It might be temporary and of no significance, but it was curious, and he would like to see it analyzed. "I am not at all sure that our jaded nerves and silly tactics are really due to decadence. In part they are merely due to overwork."
