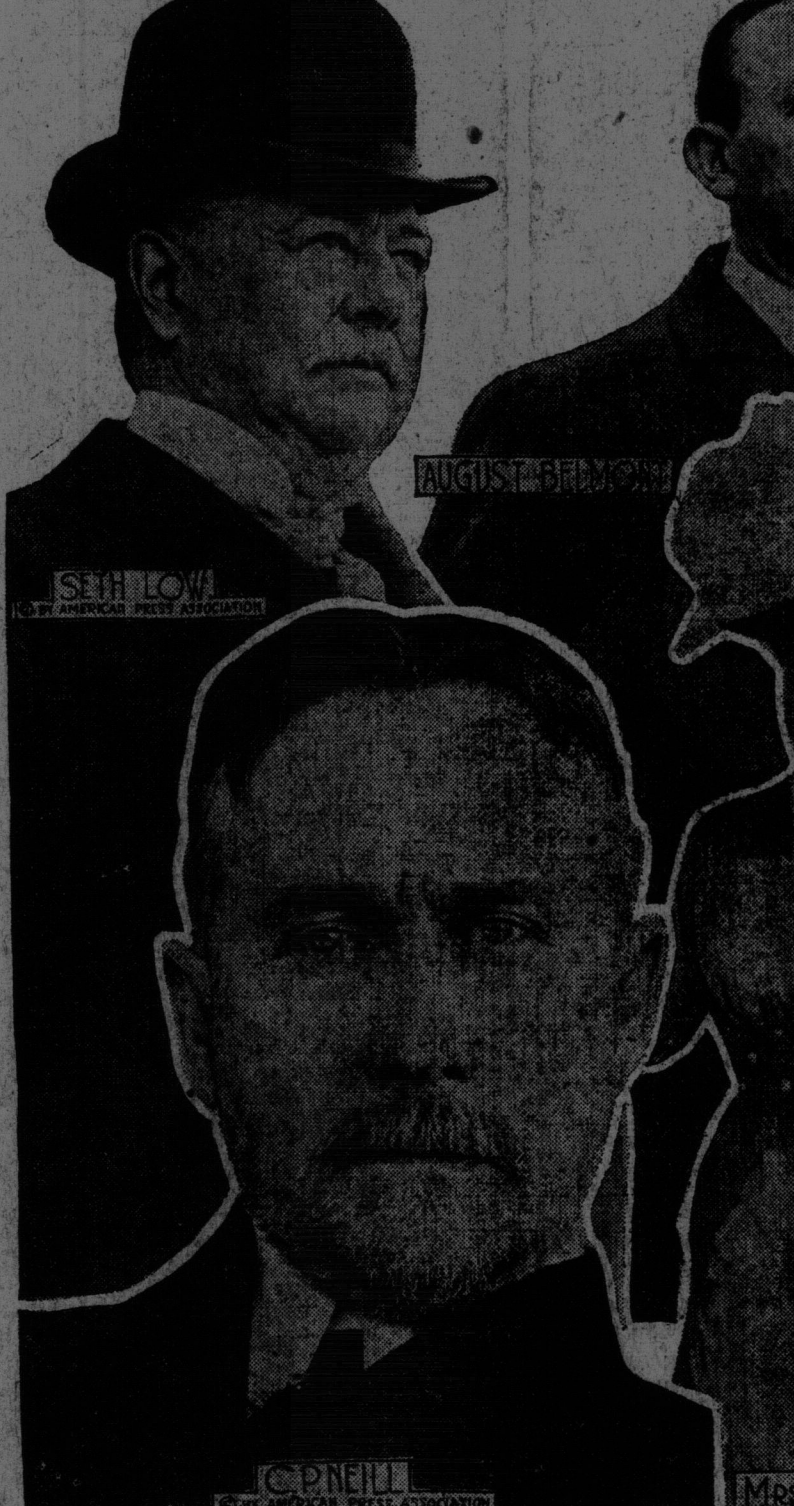

MODEL CITY FOR NEW UTOPIA IN SOUTH AMERICA

Investigation of Scheme Set on Foot by Inspector and Consul-General—Right Fellows Are in Wrong

New York, Jan. 27.—The thousands of discontented souls throughout the United States and Canada who have become interested in the Order of Right Fellows and its beautiful scheme for the establishment of a Utopia on a great tract of land in Brazil, 810 down and 81,000 in monthly instalments, will be doubly interested today to learn that Chief Post-Office Inspector Warren W. Dickson and Jesuino Ferreira de Cunha, the Brazilian consul-general, are also interested. So much so, in fact, that the latter pair have asked the officers of this extraordinary enterprise to make a full explanation of their project.

Inspector Dickson's chief interest lies in the use of the mails for the collection of subscriptions to the fund on which the establishment of the Utopia is based. There are six officers of the Right Fellows in this city, including a minister, President Dr. John Albertson, a student of the University of Toronto, a correspondent secretary, James A. Ford, editor of the Encyclopedia of Social Reform, with an office in the Bible House, and an organizer, Dr. John Verter, the inventor of a patent washing machine.

IMPORTATION OF TREES AND PLANTS INTO CANADA

All persons who are accustomed, or intend, to import trees, shrubs, plants and to ship such trees and plants from one province to another, should make themselves thoroughly familiar with the regulations of the Dominion and provincial governments in relation to the importation of dangerous pests into Canada or their spread from one province to another.

The regulations governing the importation of vegetation of various kinds into Canada, and the Dominion and provincial laws under which they have been passed, have been collected in a convenient form and published as a bulletin with explanatory notes by the Dominion entomologist, Dr. G. Gordon Hewitt. This bulletin, entitled, "Legislation in Canada to prevent the introduction and spread of insects, pests and diseases destructive to vegetation into Canada" is published as Bulletin No. 11, second series, of the Experimental Farms Branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture. It may be obtained free on application to the Publications Branch, Department of Agriculture, Ottawa. The laws and regulations of the Dominion government and of the governments of those provinces possessing such legislation, British Columbia, Nova Scotia, Ontario and Prince Edward Island, are given. A full explanation of the regulations which must be observed by persons importing nursery stock, which comprises trees, shrubs, plants, vines, etc., into Canada and into the provinces mentioned, is given.

A perusal of this bulletin, even by those who do not import or intend to import plants, will afford the reader an excellent idea of the strict supervision and care that is being exercised to prevent the introduction of further insect pests into Canada. More than half of the serious pests of Canada are not native to the country but have been introduced or have migrated hither. The object of this legislation is to prevent further introduction and spreading and the benefit which is resulting from the careful inspection and treatment when necessary, of imported plants is incalculable and as the means of saving the country enormous losses.
