HEAVY TRADE FORECAST
Bank Forecasts Rise in Manufactures For Home Use and Export.

Manufacturers are preparing for an exceptionally busy season, both in their domestic industries and the export trade, in the view of the National City Bank, New York, which points out that in many cases manufacturers are doubling their importation of raw material compared with a year ago, while on the export side manufacturers are the group of articles which shows an increase in exportation, while other groups show a decline. Manufacturers exported in August, the latest month for which official figures are available, showed an increase of 15 per cent in value compared with the same month last year, while other articles exported showed a reduction of more than thirty per cent in value in the same period. The few figures thus far received for September exports indicate that the record of that month will also show a heavy fall in exports of non-manufactured material, and probably an increase in manufactures exported.

"The startling factor in the activities of the manufacturers at the present time is in the tremendous increase in their importation of raw materials," says the bank in reviewing the situation. "Practically every important article for which our manufacturers require foreign material shows large increase in the quantities imported in August, 1922, when compared with those of August, 1921. The chief importations for manufacturing materials are: Cotton, silk, wool, flax, rubber, hides, furs, tobacco, tin, copper, lead, zinc, pig iron, lumber, paper stock, ferrous metal, and many others. In the same month of last year, and of furs, of which we are also large importers, over 14,000,000 pounds, against 7,000,000 in the same month last year. Of India rubber, for which we are entirely dependent on other countries since we produce none at home, the imports of August were 54,000,000 pounds, against 27,000,000 in the same month of last year."

PUNISHABLE BY DEATH
Russia Taking Drastic Measures Against Grafting

Moscow, Nov. 1 (by mail)—A strenuous campaign against graft among state employees, inaugurated some time ago by the Soviet government, has brought to trial in various parts of the country hundreds of individuals, some of whom already have been convicted and put to death for their trickery.

At Nishni Novgorod, eight men accused of swindling the government in connection with the installation of an electrical plant along the Volga, were sentenced to be shot, while 21 others tried simultaneously were sent to prison for various terms of years.

In connection with the collecting of the grain tax imposed by the state, three men in the Moscow district, charged with making false entries of the grain tax, were sentenced to pay the supreme penalty, while 42 of the same group were acquitted.
