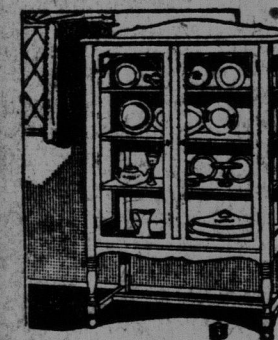

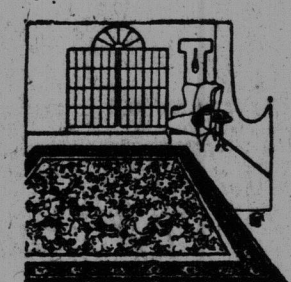

and the pick of the late Earl of Crawford's stamps.
The London stamp firm of Stanley Gibbons, probably the largest dealers in the world, was the purchaser. Fred J. Melville, the English stamp authority, says that the collection is incomparable in size, completeness and condition. He expressed regret that so complete a record of New Zealand's stamps should now be broken up, but the price paid, he says, "is strong evidence of the solid foundation upon which philately now rests."
"The chief wealth of the collection," says Mr. Melville, "lies in the numerous copies, including unused, of the various local experimental perforations. These are of great technical interest to philatelists. In a number of instances the copies are the only examples known. All of the complicated vignettes of the classic 'full-face Queen' stamps of New Zealand owe their existence to the part of Messrs. Perkins, Bacon & Co. of London, which the firm had good collections formed by the late L. L. R. Mann of Bexley, and after his death, Hausburg, M. P. Castle, A. T. Bate

one-penny, two-penny, six-penny and one shilling from a die engraved by William Humphreys, showing the Queen after A. E. Chalon's portrait of her late Majesty in robes of state.

"Having constructed the plates and printed off the first supply, I made the mistake of sending out the plates to the colony with the London printed stamps. According to official records still in existence, there was only one person in the town of Auckland who was competent to print postage stamps, a J. Richardson, who printed all the stamps required in the colony until 1862, when a printing department was set up in the office of the Postmaster General. But for the accidental dispatch of the plates to New Zealand, the stamps during the first twenty years, 1835-1874, might have all been printed in London. Incidentally, this would have deprived philatelists of a most fascinating, if complicated, study of the numerous printings on various papers with freak perforations as produced in the colony.

The late Mr. Hausburg, it is stated, while on a visit to New Zealand, found the original plates, and he obtained permission to take two proofs of each plate

BIG LONDON STAMP SALE.
Dealers Pay \$23,000 for Finest New Zealand Collection.
New York, Feb. 16—A striking illustration of the value of a specialized collection of postage stamps from a single country has recently been given in London in the sale for £20,000 of the best collection of New Zealand stamps ever gathered together. At the existing rate
