from the same quarter, was made on the atonement. was followed by the onset of the Philistines of material philosophy. Now the authorship and integrity of the Old Testament is assailed by the Higher Criticism. How shal! the religion of Christ be successfully defended against this persistent warfare of the enemy?

The Bible in the hands, homes, and hearts of the people at large has been, and will continue to be an impregnable fortress to successfully withstand these foes. To give the people in their own tongue the Word of God is the mission of this Society, and it merits the prayers, sympathies, and material support of the christian public.

The third resolution was moved by Mr. J. Burgoyne, seconded by Mr. E. J. SMITH, as follows:

That the officers and committee be reelected, with such alterations, and additions as may be necessary from nonattendance or removals.

All the resolutions were unanimously adopted. choir of the church was present and rendered several hymns and anthems.

Before the close of the meeting, a collection was taken up in aid of the Society in its work. The meeting was closed with the benediction by BISHOP COURTNEY.
