

UNIVERSITY LYING-IN HOSPITAL

SUBMITTED TO THE MEETING OF SUBSCRIBERS,

October 1st, 1869.

The Committee of Management have much pleasure in reporting to the subscribers the continued prosperity and success of the Hospital. During the year just brought to a close there were 143 patients confined in the wards, all of whom were discharged well, no death having occurred in the institution. For these results the Committee desire to return their earnest and grateful thanks to Divine Providence.

The number of patients admitted during the year just closed was 145. Of these there were:

The improvements which have been made in the building, and for which additional rent has been paid to the proprietor, have proved to be of the greatest benefit to the patients. There have been no outbreaks of fever as formerly, and the patients have convalesced more satisfactorily. For the carrying out of these improvements the thanks of this Committee are due to their First Directress, Mrs. Molson, who has manifested in this, as in all other matters relating to the successful working of the Hospital and the well being of the inmates, the kindest interest.

Too much praise cannot be awarded to the matron, Mrs. McBride, for the efficient and

of his kindness and attention to the interests of the Hospital.

A reference to the Treasurer's account, which is herewith subjoined, will exhibit the sources of revenue of the Hospital and the application of its funds in general expenditure.

The balance at present on hand is much less than that of last year, but it is to be observed that, during the year, an investment was made in eleven shares of the Merchants' Bank of this city, which, with broker's fees, amounted to £295 12s 6d. This sum accounts for the principal part of the difference. Your Committee have only to remark that the strictest economy has been observed in their expenditure.
