belong to the paim ramity. First must be mentioned the Insis palm of the banks of the Amazon, the leaves ot which are no less than 50 feet in length by 10 to 12 in width. Certain leaves of the Ceylon palm attain a length of 20 feet and the remark-able width of 16. The natives use them for making tents. Afterward comes the cocoanut palms, the usual length of whose leaves is about 30 feet. The unbrells magnolia of Ceylon bears leaves that are so large that a single one may sometimes serve as a shelter lor fitteen or twenty per-sons. One of these leaves carried to Eng-land as a specimen was nearly 36 feet in width. The plant whose leaves attain the greatest dimensions in our temperate clim-ate is the Victoria regia. A specimen of this truly magnificent plant exists in the garden of the Royal Botanical Society of Edinburgh. Its leaf, which is about seven feet in diameter, is capable of supporting a weight of 305 pounds.

What trees bear the largest leaves in the second se ong to the palm family. First mu ntioned the Inaja palm of the bank
