**T. P. SHONT'S HOME
ON FARM STRIPPED
OF FURNISHINGS**

**Traction President Revealed
as Owner of Estate Near
Philadelphia.**

New York, Nov. 14.—Aside from his
duties as president of the Interbor-
ough Rapid Transit Company, Theo-
dore P. Shonts was revealed recently
as possessing a farm of 380 acres in
the suburbs of Philadelphia, where he
loved to roam about and live as a gen-
tleman farmer. In the most recent
developments of the fight begun in
the Surrogate's Court by his wife,
Mrs. Milla D. Shonts, to prevent any
share of the estate going to Mrs.
Amanda C. Thomas, described in his
will as "my friend," came the dis-
closure that Mr. Shonts left not only
\$475,000 in personal property, as stat-
ed in the petition for probate, but was
the owner of the farm in Pennsylvania
and several pieces of property in
Chicago.

During his leisure time Mr. Shonts
used to go to his farm, on which was
a large house. In his boyhood days
Mr. Shonts lived on a farm and his
knowledge of agricultural pursuits led
him in later life to acquire a place for
himself where he could experiment in
the problems of the soil. The farm
is equipped with the most modern
implements.

Furnishings of House Disappear.
Before anyone representing Mrs.
Shonts could make an appraisal of the
farm and its accessories, including
the contents of the house, it was dis-
covered that the rich furnishings in
the dwelling had disappeared in much
the same mysterious manner that his
Park avenue apartment was stripped
of its furnishings valued at \$50,000.

A few days after the death of Mr.
Shonts, several vans drove up to the
big farm house and some men trans-
ferred all of his belongings and the
furnishings to the vans. They then
drove away before the destination
of the property could be learned.

Since that time George W. Files
and Warren Dixon, attorneys for Mrs.
Shonts, have been endeavoring to as-
certain what happened to the men who
took away the property.
