

SALVAGE VESSEL VALUABLE HELP IN WAR PERIOD

Remarkable Work Performed by the "Ranger" in Saving Ships. ENEMY CRAFT ADDED TO FLEET. Lifted Sub from Bottom of the Sea and Saved Crew and Ship.

Special to The Standard. London, March 18.—Some striking details of achievement in connection with the salvage of warships and other vessels in the course of the war were revealed at the annual meeting of the Liverpool Salvage Association.

Salvage of Marlborough. H.M.S. Marlborough having been torpedoed at the Battle of Jutland was able to reach the Humber under her own steam.

Another interesting fact was that between 18th June, 1917, and 17th June, 1917 (ten days), four vessels, with a total deadweight of 36,400 tons, were safely brought to Southampton waters and beached, after having been torpedoed in the Channel.

These vessels were the:— Oldfield Grange, S.S., in ballast; torpedoed and sunk, deadweight 8,500 tons; S.S., in ballast; torpedoed and sunk, deadweight 8,500 tons; Marguerite, S.S., laden with coal, torpedoed and sunk, deadweight 5,500 tons; Mahopac, S.S., laden with a general cargo; torpedoed and sunk, deadweight 7,500 tons.

As stated, total deadweight of 36,400 I would remind you that four large steamers, with a total deadweight of 36,400 tons, which had been torpedoed and sunk in the English Channel were in ten short days floated and brought into good safety by the efforts of our people.

Aid To Warships. The following is a brief description of some of the more important salvage operations during the period of the war:—

H. M. S. Conqueror.—This vessel, having been in service as a collector, was being steamed back to her anchorage in Scapa Flow, with her forward compartments full of stores.

H. M. S. Lion.—Admiral Beatty's flagship at that time, after being severely damaged during the Battle of Jutland, was towed back to the Pier of Forth. Having been hit several times below the water line, various compartments had been flooded on one side of the vessel, which gave her a heavy list.

H. M. S. Britannia.—While returning to her anchorage in the Pier of Forth, she was struck by a mine, which caused her to list heavily.

H. M. S. Argenta.—This vessel, damaged on the 15th day of the war, was towed to the Pier of Forth, where she was repaired.

H. M. S. Roxburgh.—This vessel was the first cruiser or man-of-war that having been hit by a torpedo, was able to steam back to harbor.

"Viking" Only Vessel to Make Any Large Catch So Far This Season.


