THE LATEST MOVE

Is that by which the St. John Branch acquires increased accommodation for The Frost & Wood Company's rapidly expanding trade in the Provinces of New Brunswick and P. E. Island, which are under the management of this branch.

The new home of the St. John Branch is located on the north side of King Square, Nos. 51 55, St. John, N. B., next dcor to the Park Hotel. This warehouse has been especially adapted to the Company's requirements, affording greatly improved facilities for the conduct of its business here.

The main building is fifty feet square, four stories high, and basement, with an ell seventeen feet wide and fifty-three feet long, in the rear.

The upper stories and basement of the main building will be used for storage, access being had thereto through a rear entrance by means of electric power elevator.

A commodious suite of offices is fitted up in the ground floor of the ell, while upon the floors above it are the Extra Parts Department and Work-shop.

The ground floor of the main building constitutes a large, well lighted show-room about 48 feet square, where a full line of samples will be kept on view, and where visitors will be welcome whether a purchase is intended or not.
