WHY ABOUT THE SALISBURY RAILWAY?

Electorals of Albert Can Read Here Proof of the Federal Government's Faithful and Strenuous Efforts to Take Over the Railroad and the Opposition and Obstruction Offered by Tory Politicians Toward the Railway Company.

Owing to the prolonged obstruction and delay offered by Tory politicians through the Salisbury and Albert railway Co., the efforts of the federal government to take over that railroad, have it repaired at once, and operate it as part of the Intercolonial, have been blocked for weeks. Manager Sherwood and E. P. Raymond, law partner of Francis Hanson, have been promising every day that the agreement would be signed and the transfer made, and they have admitted that the dominant government has shown its good faith in reaching the right compromise in order to hurry through the transfer.

This proposition, made in the interests of the people of Albert county, was a genuine one, and satisfied the hopes of many years expected that the efforts of the several representatives would some time or other result in full fruition, and there arose a strongly expressed public sentiment that, should this proposition be promptly accepted, it should be withdrawn, and other steps taken by the government to relieve the most trying situation, in preparation to instruct Monon to deliver rails, etc., for relaying immediately on company signing agreement as arranged.
