Selling Liquor without License. Joe Phillips, of West street, was this morning in the Police Court, charged with selling liquor without license.

The witness in the case was Catherine Jenkins, who got drunk and was arrested on Sunday. She testified to getting some of liquor, "like brandy," and that it made her drunk. It was not ginger ale. For the defence Phillips, who conducted his own case, brought three witnesses. His first witness, a young man named Johnson, attested the fact by swearing that he had purchased port wine and brandy in Phillips' saloon. The other witnesses were two women and a man, who said they knew nothing of Miss Jenkins buying liquor. Further, they said she was drunk when she went to the house. The Magistrate, on the evidence of his own witness, found her guilty, and fined her \$40. Phillips said he would go to jail, but he appealed to another court. The Magistrate told him he would issue a warrant for his arrest.
