### THE **AMUSEMENTS** TAX ACT

Every person attending an exhibition erformance or entertainment at a place of amusement to which an entrance or admission fee is charged shall on each admission thereto pay an amusement

(1) When the price of admission is from 10c to 20c inclusive, a tax (2) When the price of admission

more than 20c and not more than 75c, a tax of 21/2c. (3) When the price of admission is more than 75c and not more than \$1.00, a tax of 5c.

(4) When the price of admission is more than \$1.00 but not more than

(5) When the price of admission is more than \$2.00, a tax of 25c.

(')) A tax of 25c shall be paid by every person attending any boxing bouts or contests.

(7) Where admission is given by pass or complimentary tickets a tax shall be payable at the highest rate charged for the performance to which admission is granted.

### PENALTIES

Every person who, without having mary conviction, to a penalty of not more than \$50.00 for each offence, and in default of the payment of the fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than six months.

Every owner of a place of amusement and every employee of an owner of a place of amusement who permits or authorizes or is a party or privy to the ment of the tax provided for by this Act, shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty of not less than \$25.00, nor more than \$200.00 for each offence, and, in default of payment of the fine and costs, to impris not more than six months.
