GIANT GERMAN DREADNAUGHT BROUGHT DOWN.

The Giant Airplane, Germany's Biggest Bombing Machine, known as the Lisner model, was brought down recently in the neighborhood of Retx, southeast of Soissons. It carried nine men, including the pilot officer commanding, three observers and machine guns, two specialist engineers, a second pilot in charge of the engines, and two assistant engineers. It also carried two tons of bombs and four machine guns, and attained a speed of 75 to 80 miles an hour. The important parts and dimensions of the huge machine are indicated in this diagram.


