He shall give to the officers, noncommissioned officers and Militia-men of the Battalions or Companies of two thousand unmarried persons, and to the aforesaid Volunteers the same pay and allowances as His Majesty's regiments of Infantry have a-right to receive—computing from the day of their departure from the rendezvous of their companies for actual service until they are discharged. He shall grant to the officers for defraying their expenses in going to their usual homes, pay for a number of days, according to the distance at the rate of five leagues per day. he shall pay the Adjutants, Serjeants Major, Quarter-Master-Serjeants, Drill Serjeants, and Trumpeters after the discharge of the Militia men as if they were still embodied, and shall give to the privates their pay for twenty days after the date of their being disbanded.
