JACKSON, GEORGE. (South Grey.)

B. at Hutton, in the North Riding of York, England, in Dec. 1809. Ed. at a private school there. M., in 1832, Miss Susan Merritt, of Willsborough, in the Co. of Kent, England. Was engaged in the grocery and provision trade on his own account and as partner in the firm of Peacock & Jackson, brewers and maltsters, for several years in the City of Durham, England. Came to Can. in 1844, and in the following year purchased the mills and estate in Nottawasaga, then known as Hurontario, now Collingwood. Was apptd. agent for the settlement of Crown Lands in the Cos. of Grey and Bruce in 1848; resigned in 1854. Was Warden of Grey in 1858-59-60-75. Was the first representative of the Co. of Grey. Was returned at the g.e. 1854. At the g.e. 1857 was not a candidate. Was returned again in 1861 and sat until the Union. Was
