Fifthly. To see that all moneys apportioned by him, be applied 2 to the objects for which they were granted; and for that purpose to decide upon all matters and complaints submitted to him, (and not 4 otherwise provided for by this Act,) which involve the expenditure of any part of the School Fund, and to direct the application of such 6 balances of the School Fund, as may have been apportioned for any year and forfeited according to the provisions of this Act: Provided 8 always, that such balances of the School Fund shall be expended in making up the salaries of Teachers in the County to which they shall 10 have been apportioned.

Sixthly. To appoint one of his Clerks as his Deputy, to perform 12 the duties of his Office in case of his absence; and to appoint one or more persons, as he shall, from time to time, deem necessary, to 14 inspect any School or examine into any school matter in the County where such person or persons reside, and report to him: Provided, 16 that no allowance or compensation shall be made to such special inspector or inspectors for any service or services performed by him or 18 them.

Seventhly. To take the general superintendence of the Normal 20 School; and to use his best endeavours to provide for and recommend the use of uniform and approved text-books in the schools generally.
