Edmonton, Alta.	1 Oct./44	Sunday	Squadron Leader G. Milson (C1976) (Admin.) continues to command the Station in the absence of W/C E.G. Macpherson (C557) (Admin.) on temporary duty. Much favourable comment has been heard not only from staff and trainees at this Unit but also from visiting officers and airmen, on the very excellent study Information Room we have at this Unit.
