SUMMARY OF EVENTS:

- October 10/4/44 No. 6 Initial Training School was officially opened and S/Ldr. J.B. Whaley together with two other personnel of the Medical Selection Board reported and were allotted two rooms for use of the Board. Painting was commenced in Class Rooms which should be finished by Monday next, together with Orderly Room and Central Registry Office. One hundred and forty airmen joined the Station at 1400 hours. Their appearance was very good. Mr. U. Hughes of the Knights of Columbus Service arrived and was interviewed regarding the details of work to be accomplished.
- October 11 --All trainees paraded and were addressed by the Commanding Officer. They were subsequently appointed to form No. 1 Squadron, comprising two flights, ("A" and "B"), and were located on the 2nd floor of the North Building. The Medical Selection Board building being erected in the grounds.
- October 12 - Sunday.
- October 13 - Received a visit from S/Ldr. MacPherson (A.F.H.Q.). Training of Course No. 38 (140 Aircrew) commenced. They showed great interest and keenness. All class rooms on the 2nd floor of the South Building were opened for use, as also Accounts Office and Squadron Offices. Converter for Link Trainers arrived and it was necessary to call for services of Link man to help get ~~LINKS~~ installed.
- October 14 - Making efforts to open the Canteen for operations. Various committees were appointed to-day. F/O L.M. MacCormack was appointed as President of the Canteen Committee while F/Lt. K.C.M. Dalrymple was nominated as the President of the Mess Committee; F/O J.N. Blow as Mess Secretary, F/O H.J. Haley Services Officer and P/O A.S. Charlton, Messing Officer. The Fire Committee was inaugurated, comprising F/Lt. J.W.H. Goodall, F/O S.G. Cooper, Cpl. Miller, T.D. and Mr. W. O'Brien.
- October 15 - Dry Canteen opened to-day. The Sergeants' Mess and quarters is being painted by contractors. Three Link Trainers dismantled and taken to the third floor ready for Link man to connect. All fire hoses inspected and nozzles and hydrant pipes being painted red. A thorough inspection of the building by the Chief of the Toronto Fire Department and the Administrative Officer and Fire Fighter N.C.O. A favourable report and useful suggestions given by the Fire Chief, which will be put into operation. First pay parade.
- October 16 - Link Trainer man reported and proceeded to connect up the three Link Trainers. Allocations of space were appointed for the Laundry and Barber Shop, and details discussed regarding operation of same. Started to roof and shingle the Drill Shed.
