



Ottawa, April 7, 1919.

Sir,-

In reply to your letter of the 21st ultimo, I have to inform you that special privileges granted to Indians by the Ontario Government only apply to members of bands located in the northwestern portion of the province, namely, in the territory comprised in the Robinson Treaties. It will, therefore, be necessary for you to secure your license in the same manner as a white man.
