

Ottawa, June 11, 1920,

Madam,-

I regret that your letter of the 23rd ult-
time, regarding the whitewashing which you wish to have
done to the fences, barns, outhouses, etc., was inadvertent-
ly overlooked and had not been replied to.

I now beg to say that you may arrange to
purchase the material required and have the whitewashing
done. Mr. Agent Brossseau estimates that the work and mater-
ial will cost about \$25.00, and you may expend a sum to
that amount for the purpose. You should prepare receipts,
in duplicate, covering the cost of the material and the
labour and hand them to the agent, who has been instructed
to certify the same and forward to the Department for pay-
ment.

With reference to the 300 cards, similar
to the sample which you enclosed, for distribution to the
children upon the closing of the school, I beg to say that
these have been ordered from the Government Printing Bureau
and they will reach you in time for distribution to the
children before the closing of the school.
