Astonishing progress has been made with the Royal Air Force Colour Portrait Collection. Nearly 700 portraits have already been secured.

The collection is intended to keep alive the memory of those who distinguished themselves in the Service, who helped to shape its destiny and that of the Commonwealth and Empire.

It is a gift costing many thousands of pounds and demanding much hard work. The money was anonymously subscribed. All services are voluntary. The complete collection, which is for the benefit of the Royal Air Forces Association and the R.A.F. Benevolent Fund, will include 1,000 portraits. These will be exhibited throughout the country so that the public may see photographic studies in colour of many of the leaders of what we may be forgiven for regarding as the finest Service in the greatest Empire in the World.

These exhibitions will be of considerable value to the R.A.F. as well as R.A.F.A. and R.A.F. Benevolent Fund, while affording great pleasure to the public.

Colour portraits have already been taken of many famous airmen. Among them are Marshals of the Royal Air Force Lord Trenchard, Lord Portal, Lord Dowding, Sir Edward Ellington and Sir Arthur Tedder; and Air Chief Marshals Sir Christopher Courtney, Sir Sholto Douglas, and Sir Arthur Coningham. Checking the lists and tracing distinguished men has presented a tremendous task, involving much work and effort. Every endeavour is being made to ensure that the collection may be widely representative. The co-operation of Station Commanders in sending the names of decorated Warrant Officers and N.C.O.'s to the Organiser, Portrait Collection, 14A, Basement, Air Ministry, King Charles Street, Whitehall (Abbey 3411, extension 5567) will be appreciated.

An imposing album is to be published, in full colour, of portraits of the more famous. A strictly limited edition will be published at 5 guineas. The publishers have most generously undertaken the work without the customary trade profit. Not only are services voluntarily, fully equipped premises have been lent rent free. Thus it has been possible to secure for air charities a very high percentage of the published price of each album sold, without lowering the standard of the publication.

The portraits are printed in direct colour by a novel process which compensates for loss in reproduction. In this way the purity and strength of colour are assured. That results are superb and are regarded as outstanding by those who have seen them.
