Question - How much damage was done to Sjt. McIntyre?

Answer - His face was badly hit about and his knee, (I think that it was his right knee) was hurt and his shoe broken.

Question - How close were you to the actual fighting?

Answer - About twelve to fifteen feet.

Question - Were you watching it closely?

Answer - Yes.

Question - Could you see it clearly?

Answer - Well enough to see blows being struck.

Question - Are you certain that the number in the assaulting party was four or five?

Answer - I could not be certain.

Question - In your original statement, you speak of "they" Explicitly, who were "they"?

Answer - There were a number of soldiers about seeing their girls home, an, moreover, I was crying and hysterical so that I could not be certain of the number involved in the fracas although I do know that it was the four or five originally mentioned who carried out the assault.
