Dear Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 2lot ultimo, with reference to the trapline of Tommy Mass, which you claim to be two separate lines and contrary to Section 5 of your Regulations, notwithstanding my contention that the Dominion Government Telegraph Line, which divides the Mass line, is not registerable.

While I do not admit the correctness of your ruling that you consider you have the right to register traplines over the Dominion Telegraph right-of-way. it would appear to me that the present difficulty could be overcome by adding sufficient of the McClusky (Indian) trapline to the Mass trapline at the north-east corner of the McClusky line, in order to effect a junction of the two separate perceis of the Mass line and bring it into conformity with your regulations, as after all, the Mass line has been in its present condition since 1953 and not subject to previous question by your Department.

I enclose sketch showing the suggested smendment of the two lines morked in green, and would appreciate your advice on the matter.
