- That is a difficult question to answer off-hand, but I should think one or two, or perhaps more, on each reserve.
- In every band there would be a man or two? Q
- Not in every band.
- Do you consider that the Indians are fairly treated in regard to these licenses, both gill and sein?
- I think so, if they were only given a chance to fish.
- Have they been treated on an equality with Japs and Whites? Q
- A I think so, as far as their interests go.
- By the fishery officers who issue the licenses, are they treated on the same equality?
- They don't get any licenges from the Government; they get them A" from the Canneries.
- Do you think the Indians should get them direct from the Govern-
- Yes sir; the gill net licenses I think they should I think they are capable of handling it.
- MR COMMISSIONER SHAW: It is a fact that white men get independent gill net licenses from the Government and the Indians don't?
- Yes.
- Have they made application for these licenses and been refused? Q
- I think so it is a regulation of the Fishery Department that no Indian shall have an independent licence.
- HR COMMISSIONER MCKENNA: Well then, in your opinion, there must be a discrimination against the Indians as against the white fishermen as far as gill net licenses are concerned?
- Yes, certainly.
- And you are under the impression that the regulations prohibiting the issuing of independent gill net licenses to Indians is unfair?
- Did you ever read the regulations?
- But you came to that conclusion from the facty that you never knew of an independent license ever being issued to an Indians
